March 21, 2019 - minutes of ATC meeting

Persons Present - Mike Quinn, Julianna Lucchesi, Ken Ryan, Tim Stearns, Glenn Mix

#3 - Public Comment - Mike Quinn noted that the Mt. Shasta Bike and Pedestrian Route Map was not displayed and available at the front desk of the City Hall offices.

#5 - Discussion regarding US Bike Route 85 project - The City had sent a letter of project acceptance 1 1/2 - 2 months ago. The need for routing signage was acknowledged as our first steps of implementation, once the availability of grant funds and/or supplies are determined.

#6 - Discussion regarding Centennial Park - Agreed that Trail A should be paved, for Trail B we should request feedback from bicycle club regarding the feasibility of riding bikes on crushed granite paths, for the crosswalk, prices should be obtained to illustrate the cost differences between pavers/speed hump/painted crosswalk.

#7 - Discussion regarding Trail Town Partnership - Determined need to connect town to Pacific Crest Trail, whether that be mt. Shasta to Weed or Castella.

#8 - Discussion regarding Bicycle, Pedestrian and Trails Master Plan and Circulation Element - The Bicycle and Pedestrian Master Plan needs to be updated every five years, so it is being considered to incorporate it into the City Master Plan, thereby satisfying that requirement, as well as consolidating documents.

Discussed the positive aspect of getting someone from the Bike Association onto the Active Transportation Committee.

To be included in next meeting's agenda:

1. The Visitor's Center has about 500 copies of the Bike and Pedestrian Route Map. A budget needs to be determined and found for revisions, reprints, etc.
2. Discuss ways to interface efficiently with related groups, ie: Biking, Hikers/ Trails, Runners, etc.
3. Identify short term projects.
