February 20, 2020 - minutes of ATC meeting

Persons Present - Mike Quinn, Parish Cross, Michael Williams, Laurel Harkness, Bruce Pope, Bruce Light, Tim Stearns, Glenn Mix

#3 - Public Comment - Michael Williams spoke on an AARP survey that indicated many people want walkable, bikable communities. Laurel Harkness noted that SORA is considering a subscription to a service that could track traffic to different areas using cell phone and automobile navigation system data.

#4 - Approval of minutes - unanimous

#5 - Updates from committee members and staff - It was noted was that the Siskiyou Association of Realtors has a fund for adding/upgrading community amenities.

#6 - Review current trail plans with community entities - Discussion of September bicycle event bringing in many visitors, as well as revenue. Expressed need for the City and Visit Shasta websites to be updated. Discussed need to get all stakeholders, including storefront owners involved in a dedicated meeting to share project ideas and scopes, intentions, needs, etc.

#7 - Discussion and possible action regarding ATC Grant Application -Discussed getting the survey out to the public, particularly school age residents. Noted a workshop in Redding on Friday, 2/21 to get input from and disseminate information to ATP grant applicants. If available, Bruce Light might be able to attend this seminar.

#8 - Discussion and possible action regarding speed limits in the vicinity of schools - The 30 mph sign next to Sisson school was a mistake and is presently getting corrected. It was noted that in order to enforce speed limits with citations, a speed survey must be done within the past five years. The latest speed survey was done in 2014. A need was noted for a current speed survey to assist in both setting and enforcing speed limits.

Motion - Tim Stearns moved/Bruce Light seconded that the ATC ask city council to authorize and fund a new speed survey. Passed by unanimous vote.
