ANNOUNCEMENT CITY OF MT. SHASTA PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT

Mt. Shasta, CA. May 15, 2022 –

Pine Street Area Water System Improvements: The City of Mt. Shasta Public Works Department, and its Contractor, Site Work Solutions Inc. will be replacing water infrastructure in various locations in Mt. Shasta beginning the week of May 15th, 2022.

The \$3.845 Million project is funded in part through a Community Development Block Grant and is designed to replace aging water mains, improve fire flow capacities, and address deficiencies in the water system. The project will include the installation of approximately 10,300 feet of water mains, ranging from 4 to 12 inches, 3,000 feet of water services, installation of a pressure relief station, 13 fire hydrants, and other water system appurtenances. The project will also reroute 6 water service connections.

Construction is set to begin the week of May 15th, 2022, with mobilization, project layout, and saw cutting. Excavation is tentatively set to begin on Spring Street. Construction activities will be coordinated with 4th of July festivities and accommodations will be made to avoid impacting the elementary school traffic. The anticipated completion date is November 2022.

Streets that will be directly affected by the project are: Spring Street from Field Street to West Jessie, Cedar Street from Field Street to West Alma Street, Pine Street from Kingston Road to West Alma Street, Field Street from Pine Street to Spring Street, West Ivy Street from Pine Street to Spring Street, West Jessie Street from Pine Street to the west end, West Alma Street from Chestnut Street to Cedar Street. Other side streets and alleys will also be impacted with closures and delays.

West Alma Street from Pine Street to North Mt. Shasta Boulevard may be subject to one way traffic for an extended period. Either a detour or traffic control will be in place during this time. It is also anticipated that there will be limited work performed at night to mitigate impacts from water shutdowns.

With the nature of this type of construction in the City streets, drivers can expect temporary road closures, detours, and minor delays as traffic control will be required. Please observe construction signs, detours, and flagmen instructions to prevent injuries and accidents and to ensure the safety of workers.
